

# **Title of the Practice 1**

## **“Blood Donation learning to connect to society through Education”**

### **The context:**

Community-based education combines the present education with community service to enhance the learning of the students for civic involvement. The National Service Scheme (NSS) focuses on community improvement through academic programs by organizing Blood Donation Camp for community service so that students, faculty, and community people can unite between theory and practice, between knowledge and action, and between the resources of Institution and Community improvement.

### **Objectives:**

1. The objective of the practice is to strengthen closer relations between higher education and communities.
2. A hope of life to someone in our Blood Donation.

### **The Practice:-**

Kisan Arts Com. and Science College's department of the National Service Scheme (NSS) organizes Blood Donation Campaign collaboration with the Indian Red Cross Society every year on 8<sup>th</sup> September in memory of Hon. Late Bhaskarrao Rajaram Patil.

During the current year 2019-20, the institution has been collected 36 units of Blood in collaboration with the Indian Red Cross Society. The Institution aims at ensuring easy availability and adequate supply of safe and quality blood and blood components collected from students, the N.C.C. Unit, teachers, and voluntary blood donors from the community for those in need.

The blood is stored and transported under the supervision of the trained staff of the Indian Red Cross Society. By preserving this policy, blood transfusion is available to the needful people.

### **Obstacles faced if any and strategies adopted to overcome them:**

Inadequacy of resources and non-availability of the latest technology for operating the blood transfusion services. The obstacles come out due to the lack of extensive awareness programs.

### **Impact of the Practice:**

The practice has made an impact on the community, students, and teachers. Donated blood is being utilized by needful people in the Jalgaon district and the neighboring area.

Voluntary blood donation camps have resulted in a great social impact on students as well as teachers. The impact of this practice is apparent on personality development, moral education, and civic responsibility among the students towards Institution, community, and the nation. It has also been observed that students develop managerial ability by organizing such types of programs in the Institution to crate social and national unity.

**Resources required.**

The community is engaged in raising financial resources for conducting various programs of blood donation successfully. The efforts by the Institution to organize blood donation camps through non-profit and full of community service.

## **Title of the Practice 2**

### **“Kisan Poor Students Welfare Scheme (KPSWS)”**

#### **Objectives:**

1. To promote the poor and needful students by helping financially for higher education.
2. To bring rural and poor students into the main progressive stream of society.
3. To create a new hope of education among rural students.

#### **Goals:**

1. To remove the financial obstacles that speed break the process of education. →
2. To build confidence among the students for higher education.

#### **Context:**

The Vision and Mission statements of the Institution emphasize the importance of creating ideal students beneficial to society. Kisan poor students welfare scheme practices the concept of economically poor and needy students. Kisan poor students welfare scheme in which financially poor students are selected. The students are adopted voluntarily by the staff to fulfill their essential academic financial needs like exam fees, admission fees, books and stationery, traveling expenses, etc. Kisan poor student's welfare scheme committee selects some of the students who are not financially well to take education. This scheme gives them a new opportunity to achieve educational progress. The parents of such students agree to send in their children because of this timely financial help.

#### **The Practice:**

The staff of the Institution individually agree to provide financial assistance to the economically poor and needy students. For this purpose a committee was constituted which identifies such students by taking applications and interviews and then by observing the interest of the students towards higher education and need the financial assistance was given to meet the expenses for exam fee, admission fee, books, and stationary, traveling expenses, etc.

**Evidence of Success:**

It has been observed that by helping such needy students their interest in the classroom and performance was improved. The students are motivated towards higher education. In the academic year 2019-20, 18 students are benefitted from the scheme worth Rs. 24300.

**Problems Encountered and Resources Required:**

Due to rural areas, most of the students belong to farmer and farm working families. More numbers of students are needed for help. Hence the resources are not sufficient but till the staff of the college has taken an initiative for partial fulfillment of this. The students are satisfied with this timely help.
